### **Learning from Historical Documents**

When Dakota Territory was organized, people wrote many letters. Letters and diaries are primary sources that come directly from an individual's personal experience. They offer valuable opportunities to see directly into the past. In order to investigate this type of primary source, the following questions need to be asked: Who wrote it? When? Where? Why? After gathering information from primary sources, historians analyze them to create meaning and understanding.

Answer the following questions for each step in the appropriate box below.

Step One – Collecting evidence (identifying and noting details)

- Look closely at one of the letters written by James Black, Governor Pennington, or the warden. Optional: There is a box for each person if you choose to complete more than one.
  - Who created the letter?
  - What is the date of the letter?
  - o For what audience was the letter written?
  - List 2-3 things the author of the letter said that you think are important.

Step Two – Speculation (formulating questions and searching for answers)

- Why do you think the letter was written?
- What evidence from the letter helps you know why it was written? Quote from the letter.
- What does the letter tell you about life in Dakota Territory at the time it was written?

<u>Step Three – Reflection (analyzing and summarizing the evidence gathered)</u>

- What did you learn from these sources?
- How did these documents reveal issues around law and order in Dakota Territorial times?
